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# Strap Up

When a man or woman prepares for war, they have to be just that, prepared. They must have on the appropriate clothes, the right body gear and have usable weapons. They know it would be crazy, irresponsible, and a death sentence to walk into a fight unprepared.

What good would it do to show up to battle with a gun and no bullets, a shield that is cracked or not strong enough to withstand or a bulletproof vest that won't stop bullets? What sense would it make to jump into battle without being strong enough to endure it?

Well this is what happens every day when Christians go into battle unprepared and without the appropriate gear. I don't mean a physical battle but I'm speaking of a spiritual battle. For the Bible says in Ephesians six and twelve, "for our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

You need to STRAP UP!

You need to prepare yourself for the battles and the enemy who will surely come. When David got ready to fight Goliath, there were folk around him who'd already counted him out. They heckled and made fun of him saying, "he's too small," "who does he think he is," "he's no match for that giant," and "he'll never make it." His power came from the God he worshipped, trusted, loved and served.

You have the same power, but you've got to stop listening to the hecklers and trust the God you serve because He'll never place you in a battle, He hasn't equipped you for. Even if it happens to be a battle, He'll allow you to lose, He always has His reasons why. You have the power, but you've got to believe it, tap into it then use it.

Whenever Moses stretched out his hand, things God promised happened. In Joshua eight and eighteen, God commanded Joshua to stretch out his hand and He'd give him Ai and defeated his enemies.

When Elijah stretched out over a child, man deemed dead, the child lived again. In Matthew twelve, when the man with a withered hand stretched it out, it was made healthy. When Peter's doubt caused him to sink, Jesus stretched out His hand and grabbed him.
